Reminders

Be thoughtful of developmental level

Look for toys that are developmentally appropriate for your child. Think about the skills your child can do plus the skills they are beginning to develop to find fun and engaging toys for them.

Toys get lost

Sorting bins and organizing plans can help toys last longer. Ziplock bags and shoe boxes are great for keeping sets of toys together. Also use play time to learn cleaning up and transitioning skills.

It takes time to learn a new skill

Like everything new, your child may need help learning how to play with the toy. Don't give up if they don't like it the first day. Show your little one how they can play and interact with the new toys. Also a great time for bonding and language exposure!
